Decide if the sentence is a statement or a **question**. Rewrite each sentence using capital letters and correct punctuation.

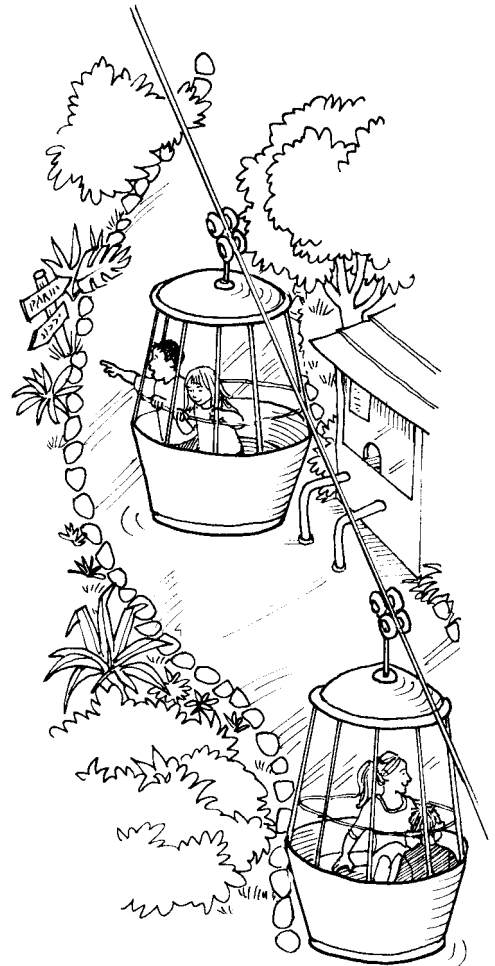

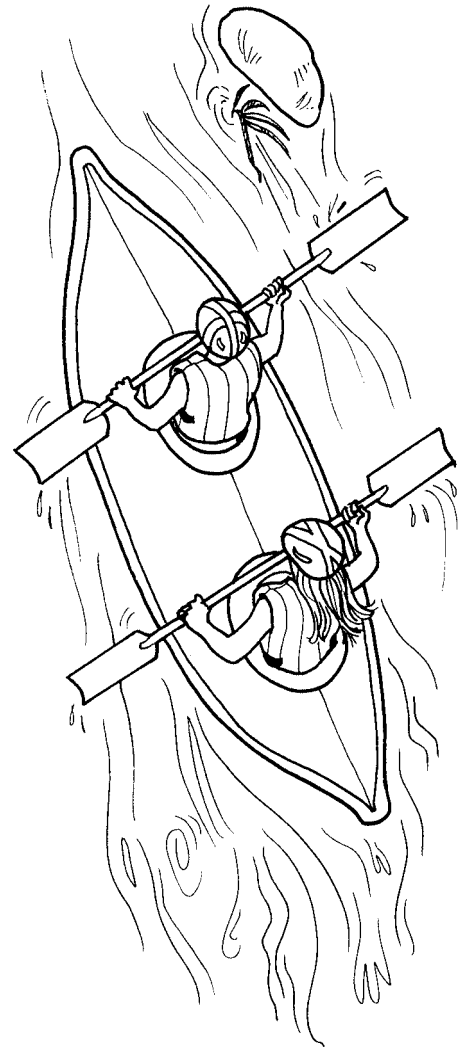
